

## Handcrafted WITHLOVE

It took a lifetime of experience and 20 years of hard work to convert this ancient farm building into a dramatically different home



Jeweller, Jinks McGrath, and her husband Steve Turner, live in an oak-framed converted cowshed dating from the early seventeenth century. Steve works for the National Trust as a carpenter. Jinks also teaches jewellery making and works with charities in India and Afghanistan setting up jewellery workshops.

espite its rather grand scale, every inch of links McGrath and Steve Turner's extraordinary home has been restored or crafted by hand - from the towering seventeenth-century oak frame to the tiny wooden. stool in the corner of the kitchen. "It's easier to show you the things I didn't make," says Steve laughing, "because I can count them on one hand." He is not just talking about the furniture dotted around the three-bedroom house. In fact, from the floor he is standing on to the roof above his head, he has restored or replaced every single piece that makes up the home he shares with his wife Jinks. Steve is a carpenter who specialises in the restoration of period buildings, which is particularly fortunate because when the couple bought their barn 25 years ago, it had a definite lean to it.

"Maybe we should have been daunted, especially as we had such a limited budget," says Jinks, "but I just knew that between us we could create what we wanted. This is definitely a house that has been crafted, not built."

Steve and Jinks approached the project in stages. By looking at the wood and the way it had been >

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So much about this house seems to have evolved naturally, that it is easy to forget how much hard work has gone into creating it. But Jinks is convinced it was all meant to be. "I scribbled a rough drawing before we moved in of how I saw the sitting room then forgot about it," says Jinks. "I found the sketch 15 years later, and we had instinctively put everything exactly where I had drawn it. It was quite extraordinary."
